

SUBJECT: Medical Support and Initiating Cases to Canada

When initiating cases to Canada with a request for medical support, be aware that Canada cannot add a child who lives in the United States to the medical insurance policy of a Canadian resident. However, it is possible for the court to order the Canadian noncustodial parent to assist with the following medical costs:

- Insurance premiums for the child in the U.S.
- Specific health-related expenses not covered by insurance such as orthodontic treatment, medications, eyeglasses or
 contacts, hearing aids, occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech therapy, and professional counseling by a clinical
 social worker, psychologist, or psychiatrist

To request that the NCP contribute to the premiums or health-related expenses, the referral to Canada must contain proof of the following:

- The specific amount of the health insurance premium designated for the child
- The amount of the specific health-related expenses that exceed insurance reimbursement by at least \$100 annually
- The custodial parent's income (pay stubs, income tax information)
