SUBJECT: Adding the Father's Name to the Birth Record at OVR

All court orders sent to the Office of Vital Records (OVR) to add the father's name to a birth certificate **must** contain a legal determination of paternity. This PPU clarifies the types of court orders to send to OVR to request the addition of the father's name to an existing birth certificate.

Recently, a court order was submitted to a local county office that contained the statement, "IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: Petitioner/father shall continue being the primary physical custodian of the children." This type of order cannot be submitted to OVR to have the father's name added to the birth record because this order does not contain a legal determination of paternity. Paternity must be established in an order for there to be a legal determination. An order that only makes a reference to someone as the "father" is not a legal determination of paternity.

The Office of Vital Records will not accept any court orders requesting to add the father's name to the birth record that do not contain a legal determination of paternity. The legal determination of paternity may be in the form of an Order of Paternity signed by a presiding judge or an Acknowledgement of Paternity from HPP.
