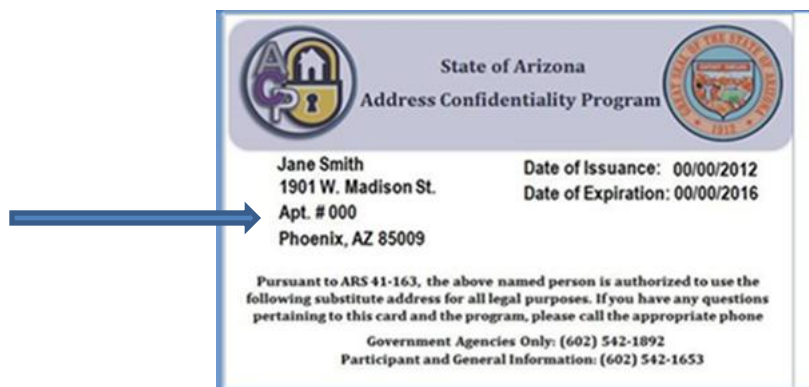

The Address Confidentiality Program (ACP) was implemented on June 4, 2012. ACP allows persons who are survivors of domestic violence, sexual offenses, or stalking to keep their residential address confidential and not accessible to the general public. The program is administered by the Arizona Secretary of State's Office and provides participants with a substitute address which becomes their legal address of record.

On June 1, 2012, PPU # 06-12-001 was published and provided interim manual procedures. Today, programming requirements were implemented that lock the ACP address. The lock prevents automate locate information from overwriting the ACP address and also prevents a manual update when a CP, NCP, or child is identified as an ACP participant.

Cases for IV-A applicants that that have identified themselves as ACP participants will interface to ATLAS with the ACP addressed locked. When DCSE staff receive a request for services from a never assistance (NAI) IV-D case participant, in any roll, who identifies that they are an ACP participant by providing their ACP Authorization Card, staff shall immediately update the ACP id (identifier) field above the address on the demographic screen panel two. The ACP id is the apartment number found on the ACP card directly under the street address of 1901 W. Madison St.
